### Managing Speed – Focusing on Road Safety

We are working with our residents across the Ward on these issues:-

- We are currently in the process of installing 'Average Speed Cameras' in Charlton village – offenders **WILL BE PROSECUTED**.
- Our request to reduce the speed limit from 50 mph to 40 mph on the Shepperton Road, between Shepperton and Laleham Village, has been agreed and will be implemented this year.
- We are currently in discussion regarding traffic calming options on Squires Bridge Road in Shepperton Green.
- Together with parents, the Head teacher and the LRA, we are in discussion regarding potential road safety measures that can be effected around the centre of Laleham Village and the school.
- We worked successfully with the residents of Charlton Village on a jointly shared venture to purchase and install Village Gateways.

### Windfall Grants

A total of £20,000 has been allocated by your Councillors to a number of very worthwhile projects across our ward.

Contributions include:

- Funding for the purchase of new benches and refurbishment of others around Laleham Village; this requested and enabled by the Laleham Residents' Association.
- Match funding for a new boat 'Zingaroo' for the Queen Mary Sailing Club 'Sailability Programme' which enables people with disabilities and/or mobility challenges to learn and enjoy to sail in a safe and specially adapted boat. We were delighted that HRH Princess Anne attended and performed the launch ceremony.
- A new soft play area for Littleton Infant School, helping with pupil safety and enjoyment of a safe play area.
