Stanwell on the up!

The Stanwell New Start project was initiated by local Conservatives. It is regenerating parts of Stanwell to ensure that all properties are of the highest standard. The first three phases of the project are nearly complete.

An extra 44 homes for the elderly, 18 shared ownership and 145 private homes have now been built. Play areas for children and young people have been improved.

Spelthorne Conservatives supported calls for the implementation of CCTV to make Stanwell a safer place. Cameras have now been put in place at a number of key locations; they recorded 129 incidents between November 2013 and November 2014.

Health and Community Centre

Spelthorne Conservatives worked with Surrey County Council and medical professionals to replace the old health centre and underused Stanwell Day Centre with something more attuned to the needs of the community. A brand new state of the art health and community centre opened in Hadrian Way in 2011. It provides many services to the local community, including specialist services for women, the obese, and other special health needs groups. The medical practice has now expanded to 12 doctors. There is a library facility and community health services are provided on site.

HEATHROW AIRPORT

Heathrow is strongly connected to the Borough. While we support the airport whenever we can, Spelthorne Conservatives are very mindful that nothing should harm the quality of life here. We opposed the idea of building a new southern runway at our border. We objected to Heathrow's proposal to build an energy-from-waste plant in Stanwell. Heathrow listened and abandoned these ideas. We achieved these outcomes through the good relationship we have built up with the airport over many years.
